District 17 Board Meeting
Taos NM, Sept. 26, 2015

NOTE: This is a partial summary of the D17 Board Meeting. The final minutes are subject to D17 Board approval at the next D17 Board Meeting in Albuquerque, NM, January 23, 2016. 2015.

General

1. Opening remarks from President John Grossmann:

John thanked Tournament Chair Winifred Stebbins and the many volunteers. During the tournament at the playing site there was free coffee, hot water for tea, baskets of candy, peanuts/chips, and snacks. The final table count was 1435, an increase of 182 tables in 2013. Taos would like to have future regionals but there is not room for many more tables. The local volunteers sold advertising space in the Daily Bulletin for \$100.00 per ad and put ads and schedule in a pamphlet. Revenue collected was about \$1.500 and the pamphlet cost about \$130.00. T-shirts sold for \$15.00 with the cost reduced to \$10.00 on the last day. I believe the T-shirts were also Sectional Tops, but I don't have any first-hand info.

2. As of September 15, 2015, District 17 assets were \$120,129 compared to \$111,053 as of December 31, 2014. Projected net income for the full year is \$1,311, which is \$24,247 below the budgeted net income. The primary reason for the lower-than-budgeted net income is the cancellation of the Phoenix regional. The major items contributing to the \$32,323 decrease in projected gross income include a \$22,632 reduction in regional sanction fees (Albuquerque, Mesa Senior, Phoenix, and Tucson were all under budget. Only Denver had a small increase). We are continuing to see attendance declining at our regionals.
3. The District will no longer contribute \$2,000 to the Unit/District reception. Units are encouraged but not required to have a “no host” Unit/District reception.
4. District sanction fees have been reduced to \$7.00 per table. District sanction fees are waived for all ProAm games (at this time only Phoenix and Denver hold ProAm games, the first session of the regional).
5. Each district may hold up to three NLM Regionals each year. Only Tucson has held one. Phoenix/Mesa, Northern Colorado, and Albuquerque all expressed an interest in holding a NLM Regional in the future. It was mentioned that a sectional can be held in conjunction with a NLM Regional. This may be something to consider. Bonnie Bagley, National Board Member, plans to introduce a motion to the ACBL Board to increase the amount of Gold Points that can be won at a NLM Regional. Seems like a good idea.
6. D17 has a license for any D17 Unit to participate in Learn Bridge in a Day (LBIAD). The program package includes a PowerPoint style set of presentation slides, a participant handbook, materials for table helpers, and the basic elements of a marketing plan. Northern CO is currently planning on LBIAD at three different sites. The October 2015 ScoreCard has two articles and contact information.
7. Rod Bias, D17 I/N committee chair from Phoenix, discussed the I/N newsletter that our own Cindy Shoemaker produced and mentioned our ProAm team game.
8. D17 Bylaws are currently being revised with the plan to approve them at the January meeting in Albuquerque.

BRIDGE BITES #53

TIMING IS EVERYTHING

Brian Gunnell

♠ T ♥ 9765 ♦ A9632 ♣ AKQ

West's 2♠ (showing long Spades and not much else) pushed N-S into the precarious contract of 4♥. Look at what happened in actual play, and then figure out how you would have done better as Declarer.

West led the ♠K, won by Declarer's Ace. With six side-suit tricks it would be necessary to score four trump tricks, and as the trump suit was so weak it was apparent that some ruffing would be required. One line that would clearly not work would be to get the enemy trumps out of the way first, that would leave Declarer a trick short (scoring only three trump tricks). So Declarer cashed the ♥A at Trick 2, and then, leaving three enemy trumps at large, he played on the side-suits. His general plan was to let the opponents take their trumps whenever they wished, but that was all they would get. He started with Dummy's high Clubs, but West ruffed the third round and played another Spade. Dummy ruffed, East over-ruffed and cashed her high Heart, leaving Declarer with just 9 tricks.

How could Declarer have done better?

Declarer needed to time the play better if he was to score 10 tricks. At Trick 2 he must duck a trump! Now, he wins the Diamond return, plays the Ace of trumps and (leaving one enemy trump at large) goes about his business of cashing winners and cross-ruffing. Altogether Declarer has 11 potential tricks via the ♥A, four ruffs and six side-suit winners, but that enemy trump will rub out one of those tricks and reduce the total to 10. Making 4♥, thanks to careful timing. Here is the full diagram.
